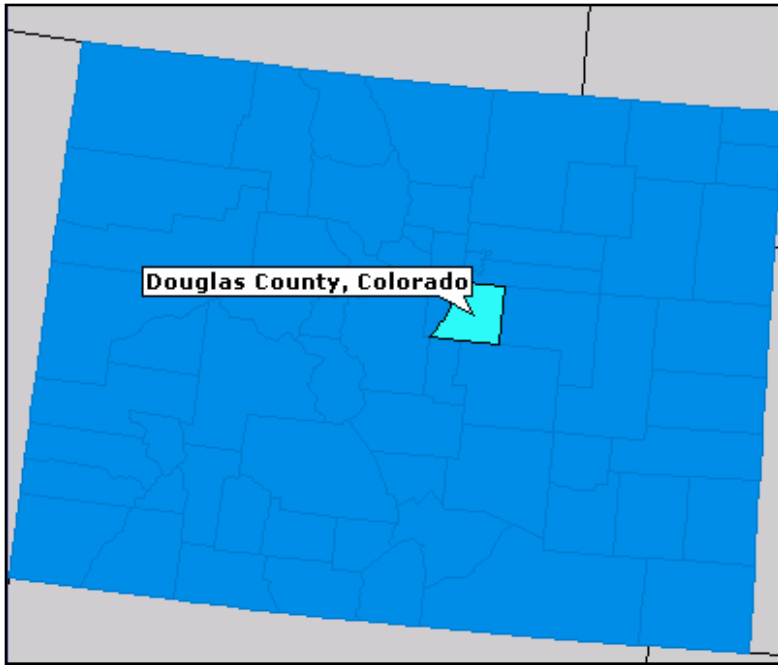

Douglas County is the 8th most populous of the State of Colorado. It's located midway between Colorado's two largest cities: Denver and Colorado Springs. The U.S. Census Bureau estimates that the county population was 280,621 in 2008, a 59.7% increase since U.S. Census 2000, making Douglas County one of the fastest growing counties in the United States.

The county seat is Castle Rock, named after a small butte just north of the town. Castle Rock is located in the Interstate 25 corridor just east of the Front Range of the Rocky Mountains.
